Collective Impact Approach

The ECI Talent Collaborative has adopted a collective impact approach, adhering to five core principles:

- Design and implement the initiative with a **priority placed on equity**
- Include community members in the collaborative
- Use data to continuously learn, adapt, and improve
- Develop a culture that fosters **relationships, trust, and respect** across participants
- Build customized solutions informed by our local context

Collective impact initiatives utilize a backbone organization responsible for building relationships, ensuring strategic alignment across groups, communicating continuously, coordinating data gathering, providing research support, and advising on available resources.

Ball State's Office of Community Engagement has agreed to serve as the Talent Collaborative's backbone as part of the university's strategic commitment to the region. OCE's Delaina Boyd and Erin Moore received an internal grant to hire Lauralee Hites and Caitlin Fleenor of <u>Stratavize</u> <u>Consulting</u> to help establish the Talent Collaborative's collective impact structure.

What's Next?

Stratavize is currently working with ECI counties that want to form a new or revitalize an existing **workforce development coalition**. They also are helping to launch the Talent Collaborative's Guiding Team and Regional Cradle-to-Career Coalitions. Their support to counties includes:

- Assistance with identifying and engaging appropriate key stakeholders for the coalition.
- Agenda setting and facilitation of the first two coalition meetings.
- Resources for carrying the work forward, in alignment with your county's stated objectives.
